



Whee Indoor Playground Summer Camp Registration Policies

Camper Age Range

6 years old to 9 years old

Important Timeline for every day

8:30am-9:00am Drop Off

13:00pm-3:30pm Field trip

4:30pm-5:00pm Pick up

Whee Indoor Playground's rules must always be followed. Persons not complying with or violating these rules will be subject to immediate ejection from the premises of Whee Indoor Playground.

- Only children over the age of 3 may use the play structure. Children under 3 may use the designated toddler play area
- Whee Indoor Playground is an unsupervised play area. All children must be accompanied by an adult of at least 19 years of age
- **Socks are always required to be worn in the play area.** Neither shoes nor bare feet are permitted.
- Food and drink are not permitted in the play area, but food may be consumed in the designated area
- Gum chewing is not permitted in the play area
- Climbing on the outside of the structure is not permitted
- Strollers are not permitted in the play area
- Toys are not permitted in the play area
- Electronics are not permitted in the play area
- All individuals should wash their hands before and after use of the play area
- Individuals may not photograph, film, or otherwise record individuals aside from their own child/children anywhere on the premises
- Any adult or child who has in the past two weeks experienced a runny nose, cough, difficulty breathing, vomiting, diarrhea, rash, or fever may not use the play area
- Whee Indoor Playground has a maximum capacity of 199 persons

Summer Camp Refund Policy

Cancellations made or requested 14 days prior to the start of the camp will be refunded the amount paid less a \$50 administration fee per child. No refund for cancellations made or requested less than 14 days prior to the start of the camp.



Safe Arrival Policy

We need to be notified for your child's absence before 10 a.m.

Pick-up Policy

To ensure the safety of all campers, children will be checked-out at the end of their camp day, and only be released to the adult(s) designated on the original Summer Camp Registration form.

Safe Eating Policy

Campers are required to bring one lunch and two snacks for each day. No food contains nuts, eggs, and/or seafood.

Inclement Weather Policy

In the event of weather that was not predicted in the forecast should arise, we will not be doing an outing outside for that day but may do an outing that is indoors, or we may stay at the facility and find another project to proceed with.

Swimming Policy

When Whee Camp participates in any swimming activities, we want to make sure we provide the best possible care to your child and their needs. In saying that, we will need to know the qualifications and if your child can swim or not. If they have difficulties swimming or not yet able to swim, they will have to wear a life jacket or floatation device while in the water. If you feel that you are not comfortable with your child swimming, then we can either have them sit out, or you, the parent or guardian, can pick your child up while we swim and drop them off when swimming is over. We also will not allow anyone without a swim shirt or other type of shirt on an outing. They need to be covered appropriately and safely.

Illness Policy

A sick child is to be kept at home for his/her sake and for the sake of other participants. Many communicable diseases begin with cold-like symptoms. If the program supervisor determines that a child is too ill to attend the program, he/she will call the parent/guardian to arrange for someone to pick up the child or express it to the parent at drop-off.

Behavioral Expectations

Campers and parents are expected to conduct themselves in a mature, respectful and cooperative manner while attending camps.

All campers:

- Are responsible for their own actions
- Will follow the rules and safety measures implemented by Whee Camp staff



Non-Appropriate behaviour includes:

- Preventing or interfering with another camper's positive experience
- Threats, bullying, harassment, intimidation, abuse or fighting
- Vandalizing or abusing camp equipment

A school bus will be our means of transportation for our summer camp. The children are expected to stay seated and to show appropriate behavior while travelling.

*Whee Camp has a strict no bullying policy and will not tolerate that behaviour at our camp. We have the right for dismissal as we deem fit, once all efforts have been made to resolve the issue.
